



## 13. ThinkSafe SAM safety poster

### What to do - Students

1. Make a ThinkSafe SAM safety poster for your school to explain some of ThinkSafe SAM's tips for a safer school.
1. First plan your poster.
  - Think of a hazard and a safety message to warn people about the hazard.
  - How you will show the hazard? You may want to draw ThinkSafe Sam on your poster.
  - What materials will you use? You could use cut out pictures or scraps of craft materials.
3. Now draw or make your poster, and make it colourful and interesting with a short safety message that is easy to understand.

**Conducting the activity:** This activity is designed as an individual or small group online activity. Students could also use pens and paper to make a safety poster in class.

**Class discussion:** Talk about the purpose of safety posters as part of health and safety promotion activities. Discuss where posters are likely to work the best and where you should put them up.

Students can design and make a poster using pens, logos and cut outs from other resources.

**Expanding the activity:** Expand this activity by asking students to develop an effective children's safety or health promotion campaign. Get them to discuss what sort of messages they are likely to take notice of by talking about some TV advertisements they like and why they like them.
